A Long History of Growth, Ministry and Adventure Anchored in Christ

1933: First recorded Lutheran Bible camp at Lake Metigoshe

A Growing Ministry Looks to Future Needs for Future Ministry

Participation in the faith-building programs of Metigoshe Ministries has grown steadily and remained strong since the Center of Life Appeal in the late 1990s made expanded ministry facilities a reality. New and improved facilities have welcomed participants of all ages and groups of all description.

Current facilities have reached, perhaps exceeded, the capacity to serve current participants well. Additionally many participants and groups are regularly turned away because of space and facility limitations.

The Specifics

Camp Metigoshe At Pelican Lake

- Of the 21 cabins at Camp Metigoshe, 15 have aged to the point where they need replacement.
- During certain weeks of summer camp each year there are insufficient storm shelter provisions to accommodate the full camp population.
- Growth in staff means that space for planning, programming and training are inadequate. The staff lounge only accommodates about one-third of the staff at a time – limiting the rest and renewal necessary to support staff in their well-being and ability to care for campers.
- Pastors and youth ministers do not have appropriate places to stay when they accompany youth to camp for the week.
- Family and grandparents' campers are forced to shuttle back and forth from the Christian Center each day at camp.

The Lakeside Christian Center

- The two prime times for hosting retreats weekends throughout the year and during the summer – are nearing 100% capacity.
- During one six-month time frame spanning 2013-14, lack of space resulted in turning away 8 groups totaling over 750 overnight guests.
- 3. Potential participants have stated they didn't bother to call to schedule their event or program because they knew that accommodations are regularly filled 9-12 months in advance.
- 4. A lack of dedicated large-group meeting and small group meeting space means that many groups must end their programs on Saturday night to facilitate setup for Sunday morning worship with Metigoshe Lutheran Church.
- Growth in ministry programming has dictated increased staff leadership and lack of appropriate office/work space has become a serious concern.

The Plan to Strengthen and Expand "Adventure Anchored in Christ" - An \$8.6 Million Development Plan

The Metigoshe Ministries' Board of Trustees has reviewed and updated the comprehensive master plan from fifteen years ago and developed a challenging plan to expand Metigoshe's capacity to serve into the future.

This plan was shared at this year's Annual Meeting and in numerous "Town Hall Meetings" conducted among constituents in early 2015. After receiving comments, suggestions and ideas in this process, the following phased plan for development is now presented for consideration.

The projects and estimated costs as presented below include all costs relative to sewer; fire suppression; electrical; HVAC; etc., and are incorporated into the numbers as presented. A 5% contingency is also included in the estimates.

PHASE I - ESTIMATED TOTAL \$840,000 At Pelican Lake

- A. Cabin replacement (15 cabins) will provide a welcoming "home-for the-week"

 still based in Camp Metigoshe's "rustic camping philosophy" that invites campers into Adventure Anchored in Christ from the moment they arrive.

 Approximate Cost: \$450,000
- B. An addition to Anna Manor is planned in order to respond to growth in the ministry that takes place at Camp Metigoshe. The lower-level storm shelter will make it possible to appropriately tend to the safety of all campers and staff during the largest weeks of camp; while updated and expanded office and staff lounge space will provide a work environment suitable for the program staff. Approximate Cost: \$390,000

PHASE II - ESTIMATED COST \$4,976,500 At The Christian Center Site

- A. Expansion to the Christian Center housing facilities, adding 13 new rooms, will allow for the accommodation of 42 additional overnight guests bringing the total to 96 (116 including bunk rooms). Approximate Cost: \$3,069,000
- B. The full structure for future development will be enclosed and readied for completion of Phase III as described below. Approximate Cost: \$1,392,500
- All construction and site preparation will be completed along with expanded parking at the Christian Center.
 Approximate Cost: \$500,000

PHASE III - ESTIMATED COST \$1,227,500 At The Christian Center Site

- A. Two new conference rooms will be added to offer additional small group meeting and conference space. **Approximate Cost: \$1,044,375**
- B. Updating areas of the current Christian Center will include carpet replacement; re-shingling of the Life and Growth Place, new folding chairs and updated worship area lighting and window replacement in the worship space.


 Approximate Cost: \$183,000

PHASE IV - ESTIMATED COST \$718,500 At The Christian Center Site

A. Expanded office space will be added to meet both current and future programming needs. **Approximate Cost: \$718,500**

PHASE V - ESTIMATED COST \$828,500 At Pelican Lake

A. The construction of "hospitality housing" at camp will ensure that pastors and youth leaders have a space to stay when they accompany their campers. This new housing space will also provide additional space for family and grandparents' camps, and offer a new and unique option for small group retreats. Approximate Cost \$828,500



Proposed Capital Campaign Goal

Approximately \$9 million

(includes allowance for administration and fundraising costs)

The Metigoshe Ministries Board of Trustees is proposing a capital campaign to fund the construction of the projects as presented. The campaign will seek gifts from individuals, families, foundations and congregations of the Metigoshe Ministries Association. Gifts will be received in the form of cash and assets readily converted to cash. Gifts may be committed over a three- to five-year pledge period and on a schedule chosen by the donor.

Congregation Gifts Campaign

Each congregation will be asked to participate in this challenging campaign effort through a careful three-step process:

- STEP 1 Receive a congregation council visit to learn the specifics of the campaign projects, timetable and activities.
- **STEP 2** Select a member of the congregation to serve as the campaign leader and have that selected leader attend a training program.
- **STEP 3** Set a goal* for the congregation and then conduct a five-week campaign effort that offers every member family of the congregation an opportunity to participate through a contribution.

Congregation Goals *

Each congregation will be asked to set a non-binding, three-year goal for their campaign effort. Recommended goal levels are proposed on the basis of the average weekly worship attendance of the congregation. The following are the proposed goal levels for congregations.

Basic Goal \$150 per worshipper
Advance Goal \$200 per worshipper
Challenge Goal \$300 per worshipper

For example, a congregation with an average weekly worship attendance of 100 persons could select from among the following three-year goals:

Basic Goal \$15,000 Advance Goal \$20,000 Challenge Goal \$30,000
